assisting God's smugglers

This year during Monday-morning chapel time, we have been learning about the persecuted church around the world using resources from the Voice of the Martyrs (http://www.persecution.com/). What began as a weekly 15-minute segment became so much more. Our eyes were opened to the troubles that many Christians around the world face every day and we are beginning to realize that we often take our freedom to worship for granted.

For chapel each week, Elizabeth, our Monday chapel leader, chose to share about different countries where Christians are persecuted. She taught the country's name, its equivalent in sign language, location on the map, and flag. She then presented the story of a "Kid of Courage" from that country. Often the focus of the mini-lesson mentioned the need for Bibles in these persecuted nations.

The new information that the students were learning did not stay confined to the walls of the chapel. It penetrated their hearts and prayers. About a month into the year, the countries about which the students had been learning began showing up in the little boys' prayers during devotion time at the end of each day. By December, a typical prayer from one of our little prayer warriors went

something like this:

Dear God,

You are strong and the best. Thank you for my cat. Please send Bibles to Nigeria, Somalia, Pakistan, India, Mexico, and China.

In Jesus' name,

Amen.

In fact, the little boys would interrupt each other's prayers to remind them of countries for which they had forgotten to ask God to send Bibles. The best part is, these prayers were completely unprompted by teachers. They came directly from each child's heart. God is good!

God is clearly working in all of our hearts this year. We are so blessed to each own multiple copies of the Bible and we often take this luxury for granted. Let us remember to pray for the many believers throughout the world who risk their lives even to own a few precious pages.

This **passion for Bibles** inspired the staff and students to action. In January, we began collecting change in a five-gallon water jug so that we could be a part of sending God's Word to those who do not have it available to them. We became more than just hearers of the Word. We are now doers of God's command to bring the Gospel to all nations.

The students fully embraced the challenge to raise money for those who do not share our

freedom to have a copy of God's Word. They scrambled to get their change together; they were quick to inform visitors of their money-raising endeavor and caused many to leave with their pockets somewhat lighter!

Whenever a student or staff member would see a forgotten coin on the ground, they would immediately exclaim, "Money for Bibles!" and bend down to pick it up. One teacher was even heard to say, "I used to walk by the dropped penny, but now I see it as MONEY FOR BIBLES!" It was not uncommon for a child to enter the classroom in the morning with a grin and reach into his pocket for the shiny treasures he brought to deposit into the ever-filling jug. Kioney and Mizael even agreed to donate the change they had been saving up to buy remote-controlled planes and helicopters. God has been glorified through their dedication to this cause.

What began in the chapel and spread to devotion class made its way to Betsy's after-lunch read aloud with the older students. She has been sharing the story of <u>God's Smuggler</u>, Brother Andrew, a man called by God to smuggle Bibles into closed countries. In a small way, we now assist some smugglers for God.

And the Winner is...

At the end of the semester, the time came to decide the country to which we would send the money for Bibles. All those present in chapel on the appointed morning voted for their favorite country by secret ballot. We tallied the results and found the winner to be Iran. The results were graphed and discussed.

Finally, the time came to see how much money we had raised. Since the little boy's devotion class inspired this semester-long venture, they were the chosen ones to take the money jug to Coinstar. **The final total raised by the students was \$246.46.** That was matched by a generous donor. Then we added in a few more outside donations. The grand total was \$567.23!

We are in contact with missionaries who are working with refugees from Iran in the country of Turkey. It is our hope that our donation will put Bibles into the hands of Iranian people and that those Bibles will safely make it into this restricted nation so that God's Word of hope and truth will spread to the ends of the earth.

May 18 we all donned blue ESD shirts and went to Deaf Nation Expo! What a fun time as we presented the school ministry and met many new and old friends.




